JOB DESCRIPTION:

Coordinate and supervise the day-to-day activities of the shop personnel to maintain the safety and reliability of the fleet. Assist shop personnel with continuing training and completing job assignments.

DUTIES and RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Evaluate fleet for repair or replacement.
2. Generate work orders, prioritize and assign jobs to technicians.
3. Ensure completion and quality of repairs performed.
4. Instruct how and ensure that repair descriptions are clear and concise.
5. Ensure all parts are recorded and repair orders are closed.
6. Maintain accurate records of fleet maintenance and repairs.
7. Participate in the hiring and training of shop employees.
8. Evaluate employee job performance and abilities.
9. Train technicians to ensure proper repairs are completed.
10. Oversee mentoring program under the directive of the Fleet Manager.
11. Responsible for checking buses for specific standards of performance and operation.
12. Evaluate mechanical problems in vehicles using diagnostic equipment.
13. Rebuild, replace, or repair major vehicle components, assemblies, and systems including engines, transmissions, suspensions, etc.
14. Check and repair electrical and cooling systems.
15. Install heaters and similar accessories.
16. Analyze engine performance and perform tune-ups as needed.
17. Perform routine vehicle maintenance and preventive care.
18. Diagnose and repair air conditioning systems.
19. Diagnose hydraulic and electrical wheel chair lift problems.
20. Continue education and certifications by seeking out and attending training and schooling opportunities.
21. Promote a positive, professional, and friendly atmosphere.
22. Operate tools, equipment, and machinery according to prescribed safety procedures.
23. Follow established safety procedures and techniques to perform job.
24. Help keep shop, equipment, and tools in safe operating condition.
25. Correct unsafe conditions in work area and report any conditions that are not correctable to supervisor immediately.
26. Work irregular hours as needed.

27. Maintain accurate records of time and materials required to perform repairs and service.
28. Drive a school bus route as needed.
29. Other duties as assigned.
